

THE BIBLE IN THE BEGINNING

THE CREATION NARRATIVE

THE BIBLE'S BEGINNING CAN BE TRACED BACK TO THE OPENING CHAPTERS OF GENESIS, WHERE THE CREATION NARRATIVE UNFOLDS. THIS ACCOUNT IS NOT MERELY A HISTORICAL RECORD BUT ALSO A THEOLOGICAL STATEMENT ABOUT GOD, HUMANITY, AND THE

GENESIS 1: THE CREATION OF THE WORLD

5. DAY 5: GOD CREATED SEA CREATURES AND BIRDS.
6. DAY 6: GOD CREATED LAND ANIMALS AND HUMANITY IN HIS IMAGE.

GENESIS 2: THE CREATION OF HUMANITY

GENESIS 2 OFFERS A MORE INTIMATE ACCOUNT OF HUMANITY'S CREATION. HERE, GOD FORMS ADAM FROM THE DUST AND BREATHES LIFE INTO HIM. THE CREATION OF EVE FROM ADAM'S RIB EMPHASIZES THE INTERCONNECTEDNESS OF HUMAN BEINGS AND THEIR INHERENT DIGNITY.

- SIGNIFICANT THEMES:

- IMAGO DEI: THE CONCEPT THAT HUMANITY IS CREATED IN GOD'S IMAGE, INDICATING A UNIQUE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN GOD AND PEOPLE.
