ORIGINS AND SOURCES OF GREEK MYTHOLOGY

- **APOLLO** – GOD OF THE SUN, MUSIC, PROPHECY, AND HEALING.
- **ARTEMIS** – GODDESS OF THE HUNT, WILDERNESS, AND CHILDBIRTH.
- **ARES** – GOD OF WAR AND VIOLENCE.
- **APHRODITE** – GODDESS OF LOVE, BEAUTY, AND DESIRE.
- **HEPHAESTUS** – GOD OF FIRE, BLACKSMITHS, AND CRAFTSMANSHIP.
- **HERMES** – MESSENGER GOD, GOD OF TRADE, TRAVEL, AND THIEVES.
- **HESTIA** – GODDESS OF THE HEARTH AND HOME.

OTHER IMPORTANT DEITIES

BEYOND THE OLYMPIANS, GREEK MYTHOLOGY INCLUDES NUMEROUS OTHER GODS, TITANS, AND PRIMORDIAL BEINGS. FOR EXAMPLE, HADES RULES THE UNDERWORLD, WHILE DIONYSUS IS THE GOD OF WINE AND REVELRY. THE TITANS, SUCH AS CRONUS AND RHEA, REPRESENT AN EARLIER GENERATION OF GODS WHO WERE EVENTUALLY OVERTHROWN BY THE OLYMPIANS. THESE FIGURES CONTRIBUTE TO THE MYTHOLOGICAL NARRATIVE OF COSMIC STRUGGLE AND DIVINE HIERARCHY.
