AS THE ANTAGONIST, ABIGAIL WILLIAMS DRIVES MUCH OF THE CONFLICT. PROMPTS MAY ENCOURAGE ANALYSIS OF HER MANIPULATION, AMBITION, AND THE PSYCHOLOGICAL FACTORS INFLUENCING HER ACTIONS. THIS EXPLORATION HELPS UNCOVER THE DYNAMICS OF POWER AND DECEIT WITHIN THE PLAY.

ELIZABETH PROCTOR

ELIZABETH'S ROLE AS JOHN PROCTOR'S WIFE PRESENTS OPPORTUNITIES TO DISCUSS THEMES OF FORGIVENESS AND TRUST. JOURNAL PROMPTS CAN FOCUS ON HOW ELIZABETH COPES WITH BETRAYAL AND THE SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS PLACED ON WOMEN DURING THE PERIOD.
