HISTORICAL BACKGROUND AND ORIGINS OF THE HOLOCAUST

RISE OF NAZISM AND ANTI-SEMITISM

THE FOUNDATION OF NAZI IDEOLOGY CENTERED ON RACIAL PURITY AND THE MYTH OF ARYAN SUPREMACY. THE HOLOCAUST CRASH COURSE EUROPEAN HISTORY 40 EXPLAINS HOW THESE LAWS FACILITATED WIDESPREAD SOCIAL EXCLUSION AND LAID THE GROUNDWORK FOR MORE AGGRESSIVE PERSECUTION.

KRISTALLNACHT AND ESCALATION OF VIOLENCE

KRISTALLNACHT, OR THE NIGHT OF BROKEN GLASS, WAS A STATE-COORDINATED POGROM AGAINST JEWISH COMMUNITIES IN NOVEMBER 1938. THE CRASH COURSE HIGHLIGHTS THIS EVENT AS A TURNING POINT WHERE ANTI-SEMITIC VIOLENCE BECAME OVERT AND DESTRUCTIVE, WITH SYNAGOGUES BURNED, JEWISH BUSINESSES DESTROYED, AND THOUSANDS OF JEWS ARRESTED. THIS MARKED THE TRANSITION FROM LEGAL DISCRIMINATION TO OUTRIGHT PHYSICAL VIOLENCE.

THE GHETTOS AND CONCENTRATION CAMPS

- BUCHENWALD: A FORCED LABOR CAMP WITH HARSH CONDITIONS AND HIGH MORTALITY.

RESISTANCE AND RESCUE EFFORTS

NUMEROUS NON-JEWISH INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS RISKED THEIR LIVES TO SAVE JEWS DURING THE HOLOCAUST.
