THE ILLUSTRATED MAN BY RAY BRADBURY IS A SEMINAL WORK IN THE REALM OF SPECULATIVE FICTION, BLENDING ELEMENTS OF SCIENCE FICTION, FANTASY, AND HORROR THROUGH A UNIQUE NARRATIVE STRUCTURE.
