THE ORIGINAL PUBLISHER OF *THE OLD MAN AND THE SEA* WAS CHARLES SCRIBNER'S SONS, A DISTINGUISHED AMERICAN PUBLISHING COMPANY KNOWN FOR ITS STRONG LITERARY CATALOG.
